OSHA's HAZWOPER standard requires certain workers who are likely to witness or respond to a hazardous materials incident be trained in certain competencies. These competencies have been further refined by the National Fire Protection Association into five levels of competencies - Awareness, Operations, Technician, & Specialist Levels and Command - each requiring different levels of training. Emergency Film Group programs adhere to the most current versions of OSHA and NFPA standards in every program we create. About the package

Included *Leader's Guide* and Resource CD-Roms help to structure complete training programs. Also included are the text, workbooks and field guide that are part of the *Hazardous Materials: Managing the Incident Package*. Here is some information on each title.

Hazmat/WMD Awareness

Teaches the competencies required of workers at the Awareness Level and shows personnel initiating actions that bring about positive outcomes. Topics covered include how to detect the presence of hazardous materials or WMDs; how to survey the situation from a safe distance to identify the hazmats involved; how to use the *Emergency Response Guidebook*; how to take protective actions appropriate for the Awareness level; calling for help.

Hazmat Operations

These five programs provide at least eight hours of instruction leading to Operation Level certification, including over two hours of video. Also valuable for Annual Refresher Training. Segment titles are *Reconnaissance*; *Hazmat Containers*; *Forecasting Events*; *Organizing the Response*; and *Tactics*.

Decon Team

Technician and Operations level training for emergency response personnel. Tells how to set up the decontamination area, describes the duties of the Decon Unit Leader and illustrates the most current decontamination methods. The basic stages of decontamination and what happens at each step are explained.

Hazmat/WMD Self Protection for Firefighters

Explores why protective equipment is needed and portrays self-contained breathing apparatus Supplied Air Respirators, Air purifying respirators and Powered air purifying respirators. The different configurations for protective clothing are discussed, with a review of the EPA's levels of protection and NFPA standards for chemical protective

clothing. There is a thorough description and portrayal of proper donning and doffing techniques.

NIMS: Introduction to the National Incident Management System

Studies the concepts that form the basis of NIMS and explains the advantages of using a standardized incident management system during complex response situations. Emphasis is on Command and Management. Using footage of realistic training events, the program shows how Command is established and transferred, the make up of the IC staff and the four major sections with roles and responsibilities of each. Also explains Unified Command.

Air Monitoring

This two-part series studies basic monitoring instruments and sampling procedures used in emergency response. It is designed to provide training to emergency responders who carry out atmospheric sampling activities when a hazardous materials incident occurs. This is the most comprehensive program available on the subject of air monitoring. The 2 segments are *Contamination Assessment* and *Direct Reading Instruments*.

Hazardous Materials: Managing the Incident

Eight titles examine each step of the process in a response to a hazmat incident. The eight steps are *Site Management & Control*; *Identifying the Problem*; *Hazard and Risk Evaluation*; *Protective Clothing & Equipment*; *Information Management & Resource Coordination*; *Implementing Response Objectives*; *Decontamination*; & *Terminating the Incident*.
